Section 4: Definitions

Sort code – Identifies both the bank and the branch where the account is held. In some cases, the first digit of the sort code identifies the bank itself. In other cases, the first two digits identify the bank. Some countries refer to the sort code as the ABA, BSB, IFSC, or BRSTN.

SWIFT code – Standard format for bank identifier codes. A unique identification code for a particular bank. It's used when transferring money between banks, particularly for international wire transfers. Banks also use the codes when communicating with each other.

International Bank Account Number (IBAN) – A number attached to all accounts in European Union countries, as well as Norway, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, and Hungary. It makes cross-border payments easier and faster to process. The IBAN identifies the country the account belongs to, the account holder's bank, and the account number.
